Dog Poison Checklist

The following is a list of the **most common poisonous household items that are dangerous** to dogs.

- Use the list to check that your house, yard and shed is safe for your dog.
- Your dog should not be able to access any of these.
- Some such as snail and rat baits are very tasty and need to be kept in a locked cupboard.
- There may be other items not included here that are not poisonous, we have tried to include the common items we see. If you are not sure about a substance please consult us.

Human Foods

- Grapes and sultanas
- Wild Mushrooms
- □ Chocolate
- Onions, garlic and chives
- Macadamia Nuts
- Alcoholic drinks
- □ Lactose (milk and other dairy)
- □ Sugar Free Chewing Gum- xylitol
- □ Coffee

Chemicals

- Radiator Coolant
- Rat and Mouse Baits
- Snail Baits
- □ Fertiliser
- Cigarettes and tobacco

Plants & Gardening

Wild Mushrooms

- Brunsfelsia spp (Yesterday, Today, Tomorrow)
- □ Fertiliser
- Potting Mix
- Insecticides
- Compost

Medications*

- □ Ibuprofen (Nurofen, etc) and other anti-inflammatories
- Paracetamol (Panadol, Panamax, etc)
- □ Animal pain relief medication
- Antidepressants
